Description: The UABC is a public State University founded in 1957 and focused on teaching, research, outreach and extension services. Currently UABC offers 130 bachelor's educative programs and 53 posgraduate educative programs, all recognized by National Council of Science and Technology (CONACYT). Has an enrollment of 64,045 bachelor's students and 1,876 posgraduate students. The academic and administrative activities carry to out in three campuses located in Ensenada, Mexicali and Tijuana, all in the State of Baja California.

The UABC has 1,383 full time faculty members of which 1006 are accredited by the Development Professional Teaching Program (PRODEP), and 599 researchers belong to National System of Researchers (SNI-CONACYT). These latest work the areas of Agricultural sciences, Engineering and technology sciences, Natural and exact sciences, Health sciences, Economic and administrative sciences, Social sciences, and Education, humanities and behavioral sciences.

In 2017 UABC entered first in the World Ranking, positioning itself among the 1,100 top universities of the world; occupies the position number 71+ in the Times Higher Education Latin America University Ranking, and 7th place among the State public universities in México.

1. Insurance

All visiting students must have health insurance. International Students before leaving their home country must hire a health insurance that is valid during the exchange period, considering that it must cover repatriation in case of death and full coverage medical insurance. The students have to purchase their own health and repatriation insurance.

Visa

All international students should take their Multiple Migratory Form (FMM) to the National Migration Institute when arriving to Mexico. For stays longer than 180 days, a Temporary Resident Student Visa shall be requested at the Mexican Consulate in their origin country.
