Pre-Departure

Housing options:	Campus housing website: <u>http://www.housing.osu.edu/</u> . Students are e- mailed housing contracts soon after admission, if space is available.
	Students may also elect to live off-campus, and assistance is available through the office of Off-Campus and Commuter Student Services: http://offcampus.osu.edu/ .
Immigration information:	Upon admission exchange students are issued a Form DS-2019, to apply for a J-1 student visa. Immigration advising is through the Office of International Affairs.
Health insurance:	All exchange students in J-1 status are required to purchase Ohio State's Comprehensive Health Benefits Plan. For the '16 – '17 academic year the cost of insurance per semester is \$1,377. For full details, visit <u>http://shi.osu.edu/</u> .
Vaccination requirement:	All exchange students are required to show proof of having received certain vaccines prior to arrival, or receive them at the Student Health Center on campus. For full details, see: http://shc.osu.edu/services/vaccinations/vaccination-requirement/ .
Estimated living expenses:	Students must show a minimum of approximately \$10,317 per semester for the '18 – '19 academic year, in a personal or family bank statement, to prove they can cover living expenses and non-academic fees.

Arrival and Orientation

Airport information:	Students should plan to fly into John Glenn Columbus International Airport (CMH), located approximately 20 minutes from campus by car. Office of International Affairs provides free taxi vouchers to international students, for transportation from the airport to campus.
When to arrive:	Students may arrive no more than 30 days prior to the start of classes (also the start date on the DS-2019) and are recommended to arrive no later than one week prior to that start date. Students must plan arrival in accordance with the Check-In and Orientation requirements below.
Immigration Check-In:	A federally-mandated requirement for all incoming international students. Immigration check-ins are held during the three weeks prior to the start of Autumn Semester and the week prior to the start of Spring Semester. Students register for an immigration check-in date and time in advance <u>https://oia.osu.edu/pre-arrival-and-orientation.html</u>).
New International	All new international students, including exchange students, are

Exchange student meeting:	This mandatory meeting covers important information about being an exchange student and gives students a chance to meet and socialize with each other. It will typically held the Thursday afternoon prior to the start of classes for the term.

Course registration:	In their first semester students register through their academic advisor. In further terms they can register online on their own.	
Academic Advising:	Students are assigned to an advisor through the Office of Distance Education and eLearning (<u>https://odee.osu.edu/</u>) and through their major department, when available. Advisors help students select coursework, assist with adding and dropping classes and provide general academic guidance.	
Course load:	Students are required to enroll full time, taking a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester, to maintain J-1 immigration status. Most exchange students take between 12 – 15 credits per term. Registration above 18 credit hours is not permitted.	
Grading:	A – E grading system; D is the highest passing grade. Some courses are graded on an "S/U" basis only (satisfactory/unsatisfactory).	
Transcript issuance:	OIA's exchange coordinator mails a final transcript for all students directly to their home institution upon completion of studies, free of cost. Further transcripts can be ordered by a student through the Registrar's website: http://registrar.osu.edu/alumni/index_transcript.asp.
