





CULTURAL AND INTENSIVE ENGLISH PROGRAM (CIEP)

CIEP will prepare you for academic studies at UNI. With experienced instructors teaching small classes, you will receive the assistance you need to achieve your big dreams.

Each session provides 20 classroom hours per week of English language study and cultural orientation. You can also receive assistance with laboratory work, out-of-classroom activities and special events. Courses include:

- Listening and speaking
- · Reading comprehension and vocabulary expansion
- Writing/grammar

Pathway Program

Conditionally admitted students have the opportunity to be dual enrolled in intensive English and academic coursework during their final levels of the program. This provides a seamless pathway for students to earn their degree at UNI.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Application Process

Take the first step and join the University of Northern Iowa family. To apply to UNI, you will need to do the following:

- 1. Go to intladm.uni.edu and fill out the application for admission.
- 2. Pay \$50 (undergraduate) or \$75 (graduate) application fee.
- 3. Submit educational transcripts.
 - 1. Unofficial documents can be submitted at the time of application. However, all official school transcripts-bearing the seal and signature of a school registrar-must be mailed directly from the institution to UNI before enrollment.
 - 2. All transcripts in a language other than English must be accompanied by an English translation.
- 4. All applicants who are not native speakers of English must submit one proof of English proficiency.

TOEFL-(Internet based) 79

IELTS-6.0 for undergraduate and 6.5 graduate students

SAT Score-for undergraduates only - 480 on new SAT Evidence-Based Reading and Writing (EBRW)

ACT Score-20 on English test

Conditional admission may be considered for undergraduate students. You will be tested upon arrival to campus and will be required to enroll in intensive English courses as necessary.

Some graduate programs require higher TOEFL or IELTS scores than those mentioned above, other test scores. and supporting documents depending on the major for which you are applying. Check your specific program online at intladm.uni.edu/graduate/majors.

COST AND FINANCIAL AID

A UNI education is an investment in yourself that will pay off for the rest of your life. Whether you're an undergraduate or graduate student, we will work with you to make your college education a reality.

Undergraduate Student Aid

International Student Scholar Award

- Scholarships range from \$1,000 to \$6,000 per year.
- Students are evaluated on academic performance, proof of English proficiency, and a record of participation in leadership and service opportunities.

Out-of-State Scholarship Award

- \$3,000 1200 or higher (new SAT)
- · \$2,000 1130 1190 (new SAT)
- · \$1,000 1020 1120 (new SAT)

Presidential Scholarship

- Students receive an award of \$8,000 per year and participate in the Presidential Scholar Program.
- High-achieving students with a history of academic excellence and potential leadership can apply for this scholarship.
- $\cdot\,$ Students must have a minimum of 1340 (new SAT) or 29 on the ACT to apply.

Academic Department Scholarships

- The deadline to submit applications for fall 2018 is February 1, 2018.
